Like so many in the community who are facing rising insurance premiums, we were amazed and saddened recently when our insurance account has increased by another \$3933 per annum, to a total of \$28,224. This means we need to pay \$2,352 per month or over \$540 per week!

"We need your support to continue."

When coupled with our mortgage interest, gas and electricity bills we need to pay a minimum of \$4,160 per month.

That is a huge amount for our hard working volunteer group who rely solely on income from 2 sources- our fundraising functions and annual memberships Currently we are struggling to raise anywhere near that amount.

Saturday, February 1st, 2025- St Brigids mass and get together with a shared meal brought by attendees.


Monday, March 10-our traditional session with everyone welcome to end the Folk Festival weekend.

MENS SHED

Our mens shed members have continued their great work around the precinct, completing maintenance and upgrades to keep our precinct in a good condition.

Our **major project** this year was to complete the altar renewal project to a standard be-fitting of the Church. The previous extension was not satisfactory and needed an addition. Steps were built and then new carpet was laid to enhance the area. **Graeme Rawson** completed many of the earlier wooden modules and the second major stage was co-ordinated by **Paul Smith and Don McDonald** during the week, with assistance from mens shed members on a weekend.

Brendan Bushell laid the carpet to finish the project.

Mens shed members also assisted in the preparations and completion of both the **new guttering** and **down pipes** and they organised and were present during the **Church roof slate repairs**. In the mens shed itself, **shelves have been built to store the wood** and it has been measured and stacked into different sections.

Our **new entrance** has almost been completed. This major project is been coordinated by **Don McDonald** and that has been to make a new safer entrance for attendees, with much earth moving and a new surface for cars to enter. With some of the soil we have also raised the area below the tennis court just a little, to allow the water to run off in wet weather.

Fencing and signage has been added to make the new entrance safer and more visible. On top of this, many **smaller maintenance and repair tasks** have been completed to keep the precinct in good order.

Other works have included- getting the perimeter trees cut back by Wayne Bryce and then burning them and cleaning up the back paddock. Colin Ryan has also been completing the complicated task of repairing the plaster in and around the feature round stain glass window at the road end of the Church. Thankyou to Wayne and Colin. We are always looking for new members so if you are up for a friendly chat on a wide range of subjects, and enjoy some good food come, along on a Sunday from 10am and be part of a friendly social group.



GROUNDS REPORT

This year most of the work on the grounds has been on the lines of maintenance. This has been a continual job as the plants in the garden beds are now well established and require continual pruning and shaping. Last year's laying of the water pipe, with three tap outlets, from the bore tank, proved very useful when the new garden bed was established in the south east corner of the yard. Some 30 plants were put into this bed and the watering in the early stages help them get a good start. A bird bath, made and donated by Kate Sloan, was installed in the Peace & Healing Garden in May. Our back paddock took on a new look when neighbour Wayne Bryce sought the committee's approval to put some sheep in there to keep the grass down. To make the area more secure, he strengthened the boundary fences and cut back all of the overhanging cypress branches which were heaped and burned. The paddock took on a new appearance and looked twice the size. A wonderful job done. The sheep were removed when Wayne went away for an extended period of time but it is anticipated that he will once again put sheep in the paddock on his return. Our crumbling asphalt area continues to be a problem with an infestation of weeds. This requires continual attention to keep the yard looking neat and tidy. Recently the entrance to our precinct has been moved further north for safety reasons. A new roadway entrance has been constructed and the former entrance closed off. A new garden bed has been formed along the inside of the front fence. This bed consists of clumps of sedge grasses which will withstand the harsh elements they experience. In all, our grounds have enhanced our precinct and we receive many favourable comments on its appearance.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Currently, we have reduced our mortgage to around **\$45,000** but as the mortgage reduces our insurance premium rises each year at an alarming rate.

Paying our insurance premium is becoming our greatest challenge. As previously mentioned, our premium is now well over **\$28 000 per annum**, despite never having an insurance claim. This is a challenge many community and other organisations are facing and it is hitting us at St Brigids, hard as well. Our BBQs, held at the Port Fairy community market over the past few years; with the main volunteers being committee members, Rob and Jose, Peter Keogh and Don McDonald as well as other volunteers, have raised almost **\$48 000-** an incredible effort. These funds have been mainly used to reduce the mortgage which continues to lessen.

Well done to our hard working team.

We are now relying on your support; you, being our community members to continue to be sustainable into the future.

GRANTS REPORT

We have had approximately \$80 000 in grants and donations- thanks very much.

Maureen Fawcett is our current grants person and without her and before her,

Michael Lane, St Brigids would not be in as good a position as it is now.

Thanks for their great efforts.

FUNDRAISING AND CATERING

Our catering and fundraising team has excelled again this year and is the lifeblood of all that is good at St Brigids. With rising costs hitting all, and especially the financially vulnerable, the St Brigids team has continued to provide **low cost meals, salads, desserts, cakes, slices, sandwiches, soups, scones, savouries, etc**, to suit the occasion.

As food is always freshly made, it can be difficult to cater for events that are not pre-sold, but the catering team always makes sure that everyone is fed.

As well as 15 minutes of fame, St Brigids has catered for many other events, including the recent **Warrnambool Orchid Show, which raised almost \$2500**. Once again, it was **Jose Farrar** who was the driver who co-ordinated this event.

Don McDonald has also been busy co-ordinating the hire for the precinct, which has included weddings, music and a variety of other functions.

Memberships have been coming in steadily but <u>we urgently need more to counter the rising</u> <u>insurance premiums</u>.

There have been many other fundraisers, with the Crossley Classical Concert held in the Church, co-ordinated by Carli Reeve, a real highlight for those who attended and raised around \$3300. Thankyou Carli.

Mary O'Brien also held her **Woven Tapestry and Art exhibition** in January which was a major success. **Thankyou Mary.**

Size of Collection

The archive collection continues to grow, with the most recent item having been donated to the collection (pictured below) being listed as Item Number 000434 of the collection.

Over the past four years the collection has increased from 179 items in 2021 to 437 in September 2024 — an increase of approximately 145 %.



Items in the Collection

Most often, the items which are deposited in the Archives bring with them their own mysteries, and this plaque is not without its mysteries.

Why was this item presented to Miss M.A. O'Brien in 1917?

To what was this plaque attached? There are 4 hooks at the back, so maybe was attached to wood. Was the wood a stand for something, or was the plaque on a box?

Donors of Items

Contributions to the collection are being received not only from families still residing in the area, but from families who have moved away: a recent donation arrived from Queensland We whole heartily thank the contributors to the Archives — each item helps create, not only a picture of the times, but also enhances our knowledge of the lives of the residents of the area.

Collection items

All matter of items are being added to the collection — items which reflect the religious, social and economic history of the area. Items range from ceremonial objects, devotional objects, printed materials, religious paraphernalia and realia.

We are continually accepting donations, and welcome any contact from prospective donors

The Archives are situated in sacristy of the St. Brigid's precinct and open on the first and third Wednesdays of each month and also the first Sunday of the month.
